# Peel Hall Primary School Remote Learning Plan



In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, Peel Hall Primary School has developed the following plan. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard-copies of work and resources.

This plan will be applied in the following instances:

- 1. An individual pupil is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
- 2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus within the bubble;
- 3. A whole bubble are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus within the bubble.
- 4. When school is under nation lockdown restrictions (i.e. only open for critical workers and vulnerable children)

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document <u>Guidance for Full Opening of Schools</u> and <u>School National Restrictions</u> <u>Guidance</u>

### Access to Remote Resources

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where possible, iPads will be made available for loan and parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning. As referenced in the DfE Guidance, Peel Hall Primary School will attempt to:

- set assignments so that pupils have meaningful and ambitious work daily, in a number of different subjects
- teach a planned and well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- provide frequent, clear explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher, high-quality curriculum resources or videos
- gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum, using questions and other suitable tasks and set a clear expectation on how regularly teachers will check work

- enable teachers to adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding
- The remote education provided should be equivalent in length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school and will include both recorded or live direct teaching time, and time for pupils to complete tasks and assignments independently, as well as daily contact with teachers through comments and responding to work.
- The amount of remote education provided should be, as a minimum: <u>Key Stage 1</u>: 3 hours a day on average across the cohort, with less for younger children <u>Key Stage 2</u>: 4 hours a day

### Software and online platforms

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources. Children will remain in contact with their class teacher through Class Dojo (to share successes and communications).

Purple Mash, Serial Mash and TT Rockstars will all be utilised to support the acquisition and retention of basic core skills.

Class Dojo will remain in use as the communication element (This will only be between 8am and 4pm). Teachers and parents will be able to message one another to share information and offer support. The Class Story page will offer the chance for teachers to celebrate children's work and maintain our school community. When using Class Dojo as a communication platform with parents this will comply with the school's Safeguarding, Child Protection and conduct policies. Any concerns will be recorded using CPOMS.

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by Coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is compulsory, as is the expectation that Peel Hall Primary School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning, but please make teachers aware if this is the case.

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to receive logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- TT Rockstars
- Purple Mash
- Accelerated Reader
- Oxford Owl

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#### Whole Class Isolation teacher checklist.

Staff to follow the below checklist to ensure home learning is well sequenced with a good level of clarity about what is being taught.

- 1. ClassDojo will be the main platform for sending and receiving work.
- 2. Teachers will send work on a daily basis to match the typical class timetable.
- 3. All work should be marked and returned to children within 48 hours of being returned via ClassDojo/Purple Mash/Teams.
- 4. Marking should be supportive, informative and enhance motivation.
- 5. Teachers should make sure that there is personal contact with children at least once a week through either a video or voice-over recording to accompany planning.
- 6. Video links and materials should be sent through ClassDojo.
- 7. If children have not returned work or engaged with the home-learning plans the teacher must make direct contact with the parent to offer support and guidance (phone).

### This remote learning plan will be regularly reviewed to endure that we are meeting the needs of all groups of pupils.
