Amongst these lessons, the children need to focus on expanded noun phrases, colons, semi-colons and hyphens as well as using commas to make our writing less ambiguous and paragraphs to organise our work. This will enable the children to write a wonderful year 6 piece of work, helping towards reaching 'Expected' by the end of the year.

Planners:
